SOMERVELL COUNTY BEE GUIDELINES

Use of land to raise or keep bees for pollination or for the production of human food or other tangible products having a commercial value, provided that the **land used is not less than 5 or more than 20 acres**.

Terminology descriptions and information from Texas Agriculture Code Sec 131.001:

- 1. "Apiary" means place where 6 or more colonies of bees or nuclei of bees are kept.
- 2. "Bee" means any stage of the common honeybee.
- 3. "Colony" means the hive and its equipment and appurtenances including bees, comb,
- 1. honey, pollen & brood.

SCAD requires 4 hives on <u>5 acres</u> with at least 1 permanent, active hive year-round. Hives must be maintained and kept alive.

SCAD requires the <u>maximum 20-acre tracts</u> have a minimum of 12 hives year-round.

*See below for breakdown of how many hives are required.

5 acres = 4 hives 6 acres = 5 hives 8 acres = 6 hives
10 acres = 7 hives 12 acres = 8 hives 14 acres = 9 hives
16 acres = 10 hives 18 acres = 11 20 acres = 12 hives

The hives must be located on the property for at least 7 months of the year. Bees travel up to 3 miles and will find what they need, or they will move. A prudent beekeeper will do everything necessary to provide for his colonies to keep them alive and will include planting vegetation if necessary.

*It should be noted that these guidelines are to be used as a general guide for qualifying agricultural land. Exceptions to this guide will be handled on a case by-case basis by the Chief Appraiser. *
