The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2020 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Granbury from the same properties in both the 2019 tax year and the 2020 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that City of Granbury may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for City of Granbury exceeds the voter-approval tax rate for City of Granbury.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for City of Granbury, the rate that will raise $\$ 500,000$, and the current debt rate for City of Granbury.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that City of Granbury is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2020 tax year.

A public meeting to vote on the proposed tax rate will be held on September 01, 2020 at 6 pm at 116 W Bridge St Granbury Texas 76048.

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, City of Granbury is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting City of Granbury of City of Granbury at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.
